Racial Profiling

Profiling based upon national origin, race, ethnicity, sex, age, sexual preference, religion or creed is strictly prohibited by the Bullard Police Department (BPD). BPD has established policies, provided training to its officers, and instituted a process to monitor traffic stops.

Anyone who feels they have been profiled or witnessed any kind of police misconduct are strongly encouraged to complain immediately. The nature of police work is such that it is often performed by a lone officer in a police unit. Law enforcement administrators rely greatly upon citizens to complain to inform them of police misconduct or bad practices.
